GUIDLINES

1. The handler with the most points will be awarded the title for the club year (July 1st to June 30th). Only titles, trial honors and scores earned between July 1st and June 30th will be eligible for the year's award.
2. Calculation of Point Totals. The Point Schedule and Bonus Points lists will be used to calculate point totals. Points are earned for each class score. Bonus points are awarded for titles earned, trial honors and titles with multiples (UDX, PUDX, POC, and OM).

One bonus point will be earned for each multiple of a title (Example: UDX2 will get an additional one point plus the original points for the UDX title). Bonus points for titles will be awarded only for the highest title earned during the competition year (Example: if a CDX and UD are earned during the year, bonus points will be awarded for the UD title only).

One bonus point will be earned for each additional trial honor – HIT, PHIT, HC and PHC (Example: If two All-Breed HIT honors are awarded then a total of 4 points will be awarded; 3 points for the first HIT and an additional point for the second HIT).

3. The handler must submit the documentation for this award. Proof may be obtained from AKC official awards reports and copies of title certificates. Handler documentation shall be tallied/verified by an impartial person chosen by the Board. This person will give a full report of applicants to the Board.
4. In the event of a tie, the dog with the most advanced title wins. If both dogs have the same title, the 3 highest scores from their highest competition class will be averaged. If there are not 3 scores in the highest competition class, then additional highest scores will be obtained from the next highest competition class (Example: If there are only 2 Utility scores, then an additional highest score would be obtained from the Open class). Regular titles and classes/scores outrank Preferred titles and classes/scores. The dog with the highest average will win.
5. The handler must be a member in good standing to compete for the award.
6. Only scores from the regular and optional titling classes will be accepted for the award.
7. **Novice level handlers:** Only an additional 12 qualifying scores (at the novice level) will be accepted after the CD title is earned. This allows a maximum of 15 Novice level qualifying scores.
